



## **133076 - Is it acceptable to feed children when feeding the poor as an act of expiation (kafaarah)?**

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### **the question**

When offering expiation for breaking a vow (kafaarat al-yameen), are children regarded as being among the poor? Does feeding the poor mean giving a particular kind of food, or can it be any food?

### **Detailed answer**

Praise be to Allah.

Firstly:

If the person who is Islamically responsible for taking care of the children is poor, and the children do not have any wealth that could be spent on their maintenance, then they may be counted among the number of poor people to be fed as an act of expiation.

Secondly:

The food that counts with regard to expiation is that of moderate quality that the person offering the expiation would normally eat and give his family to eat, such as dates, wheat, corn, rice and so on.
